He First Loved Us

A bit more than a decade ago, during the bad period of the Great Recession from the end of 2007 till the middle of 2009, most people received a tremendous impact economically. The United States unemployment rate alone reached about 10%. Many people lost their properties, some even lost their personal homes, others lost their jobs as I mentioned, many filed for bankruptcy, sadly we also knew of people putting a permanent solution to their temporary problem by committing suicide in their desperation and fears. Peoples' best general response to those times were about how to get the economy running well again? How to get back to normal? Normal is what got us in the mess to begin with. When we are in a mess, that is tremendous evidence that we need the Messiah. The world could not just go back to live as was normally living and expect better results. When we do the same, we usually obtain the same results. Today unemployment rate in the United States alone soars past 20% and the nation has now lost 26.5 million jobs. Thousands of people are dying alone besides suffering extreme pain and asphyxia. To try to get the economy running great again is a good plan, but it's secondary. Primarily we all need to fully turn our entire lives to our Creator, Lord and Savior. He said that to His disciples and to the multitudes from many cities following Him (Mathew 4:25, 6:19-34).

Six times He told them, do not worry (NKJV), do not be anxious about your life (ESV), what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on (Mathew 6:25). But seek first the kingdom of God and His, righteousness, and all these things will be added to you (Mathew 6:33).

Our vertical relationship with God should always be first then our horizontal relationships with others. Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mathew 22:37-39).
